AFC SUPPORTS WORKERS' STRUGGLE

In both the sugar and bauxite sectors there is severe disruption as the workers' unions have called on them to struggle for better wages and conditions of service. In the case of GuySuCo a "measly" 3% increase has been offered to the workers even as it is discovered that a few sacred cows in the management earn more than a few hundred workers, put together, on a monthly basis. We cannot continue to have a Cadillac lifestyle on a donkey-cart economy.

For the bauxite workers at the Bauxite Company of Guyana Inc. (BCGI), the story is even worse. The workers' demand for a better wage was met with letters of dismissal and a declaration that the Guyana Bauxite & General Workers Union (GB&GWU) is no longer recognised as the union representing workers at the company. Here, a foreign company, with no regard for the laws of Guyana and our industrial relations practices, is being allowed by the regime to get away with rank lawlessness. The AFC has not only supported the bauxite workers and their union, but has gone further by calling for workers everywhere to see that the time has come for their representative unions to unite and to cast aside political and personal differences and unite. We must all the support workers.

The Party's CEO, Leader, and General Secretary made a presentation to Guyana's female boxing champ-Shondell Alfred to help her prepare for her upcoming world title fight. Ms. Alfred thanked the party and remarked that the government, or no other entity, had come forward with support except the AFC.
