



STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

- 1. Defend Our Borders and Territorial Integrity
- We will defend every inch of Guyana's land, air, and sea through proactive border management and integrated command.
- Expand the Guyana Defence Force's (GDF) capacity and presence in key border regions.
- Deploy drones, satellites, and joint patrols for 24/7 surveillance and early

warning systems.

- Establish an Integrated Border Command incorporating the GDF, Guyana Police Force, Immigration, and Customs.
- Deepen strategic partnerships with Brazil, the United States, the United Kingdom, Canada, Trinidad & Tobago, Suriname, and other international allies.
- Train and equip Indigenous communities to assist in monitoring illegal crossings and reporting incursions.

2. Confront Venezuela's Hybrid Threats

- Guyana must be prepared to counter unconventional threats, including migration surges, propaganda, and
 foreign infiltration.
- Develop national protocols to detect and expel foreign agents, saboteurs, and hostile operatives.
- Create a comprehensive migration
 policy to manage the flow of persons
 entering Guyana for work or resettlement.
- Require biometric screening and background checks for all migrants.
- Strengthen counter-intelligence capacity within national security agencies.
- Introduce modern legislation to address hybrid warfare, cybersabotage, espionage, and disinformation campaigns.

3. Combat Organized Crime, Guns, and Gangs

- We will dismantle criminal networks and reduce violent crime through specialized enforcement and intelligence-driven policing.
- Establish a Joint Gang and Gun Crime
 Unit under the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- Introduce a national ballistic registry, gun tracking systems, and digitized firearm registration.
- Enact anti-racketeering legislation · targeting organized crime and money laundering.
- Expand police patrols, undercover units, and CCTV networks in high-crime areas.

4. Enhance Hinterland Security and Cross- Border Crime Response

- We will ensure that remote communities are protected and criminal activity across borders is swiftly addressed.
- Launch a Hinterland Stabilization Task
 Force to investigate and remove illegal foreign residents.
- Formalize small and medium-scale mining under environmental and tax regulation.
- Crack down on the illegal trade of fuel, explosives, and weapons in mining districts.
- Improve intelligence-sharing and coordination with Brazil, Suriname, and Venezuela on cross-border crimes.

to 5. Protect Women, Children, and Families

- We will act decisively to end domestic violence, child abuse, and gender-based crimes.
- Expand Domestic Violence Units to every region with trained first responders.
- Upgrade the 24/7 Gender-Based Violence (GBV) Hotline, and increase the number and capacity of emergency shelters.
- Enforce mandatory reporting and ongoing training for police officers, health workers, teachers, and magistrates.
- Establish a Child Protection and Abduction Response Unit within the Guyana Police Force.
- Launch national public awareness campaigns to challenge harmful cultural norms and promote safety for women and children.

6. Reduce Road Carnage and Enforce Traffic Laws

Road safety is a matter of public health



and national productivity. We will introduce systems to reduce accidents and save lives.

- Create a National Road Safety Authority Governance to guide enforcement, policy, and · education.
- Deploy traffic cameras, random DUI checkpoints, and implement harsher · penalties for dangerous driving and noise pollution.
- Launch a driver penalty points system and retesting programme for repeat · offenders.
- Expand road safety education in schools and local communities.

7. Secure Our Oil, Ports, and Critical Infrastructure

- As Guyana's economy grows, so does our responsibility to protect its lifeblood—our energy, ports, and logistics hubs.
- Develop a **Petroleum and Energy Security Framework** for offshore and onshore operations.
- Protect FPSOs, pipelines, and refineries lavered security—physical, with electronic, and cyber-based.
- Conduct quarterly threat assessments on major infrastructure and commercial transport corridors.
- Create an **Energy Security Task Force**

trained in sabotage prevention and crisis response.

8. Reform and Modernize National Security

- Effective security requires leadership, updated laws, and modern tools to combat today's threats.
- Establish a National Security Council, chaired by the President, to oversee strategic defence and intelligence operations.
- Pass new legislation to tackle organized crime, terrorism, cyber threats, and espionage.
- Appoint a **Special Prosecutor** focused on corruption, state sabotage, and gangrelated offences.
- Modernize and retool police and military forces to match 21st-century security demands.
