# RESTORING DIGNITY AND LIVELIHOODS

- Land for the Landless: Allocate serviced farmland to youth, single mothers, Indigenous people, and ex-sugar workers.
- Living Wages & Social Security: Implement a minimum income policy for small farmers and ensure NIS and healthcare coverage.
- People-Centred Extension Services:

- Retrain and decentralise extension officers to focus on education, dignity, and collaboration.
- National Recognition Programmes: Honour farmers with awards, scholarships for their children, and storytelling platforms.

# FOOD SECURITY AT HOME AND FOR THE CARIBBEAN

- Establish a National Nutrition & Food Security Council to monitor production and consumption.
- Provide transportation subsidies for nutrient-dense foods.
- Make Guyana a licensed organic certifier for CARICOM.
- Establish **food banks** in every NDC and Indigenous Hub.
- Create Micro-loan Centres for foodrelated ventures.
- Turn schools into food hubs with shade



houses, aquaponics, and agroecological systems.

- Develop cassava starch processing in Indigenous communities.
- Build dehydration chambers, regional seed hubs, and sanitary packaging centres for small producers.
- Develop certified processing facilities for meat and fish.
- Train chefs (not cooks) and install industrial-grade kitchens regionally.
- Develop urban and peri-urban agriculture with grants for community gardens.
- Form **strategic partnerships** under the 25 by 2025 initiative.
- Achieve grain and protein independence by investing in local feed production.
- Establish export ports in Regions 1, 2, 3, 5,
  6, 7, and 10.

### MODERNISATION WITH A HUMAN TOUCH

- Create regional agri-innovation hubs with access to drones, soil testing, advisory apps.
- Develop digitally connected cooperatives.
- Implement solar-powered irrigation and flood-resilient infrastructure.
- Provide real-time data to farmers via SMS or app.

# CLIMATE RESILIENCE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

- Develop national land use maps to protect forests and manage salinity.
- Offer agroecology incentives for composting, crop rotation, pest control.





- Establish **flood-ready zones** and transition vulnerable areas to a quaculture.
- Fund community climate adaptation projects.

### AGRO-PROCESSING, EXPORT & ENTREPRENEURSHIP

- Launch a National Agro-Processing Incubator for youth, women, and Indigenous producers.
- Create Export Enablement Zones with fast-track services.
- Initiate a **Buy Local Campaign** for public institutions.
- Upgrade farmers' markets with sanitation and digital POS systems.

### INSTITUTIONAL & GOVERNANCE REFORM

- Revive the sugar industry with community-owned agri-parks and multicrop farms.
- Convert sugar lands into mixed-use
   farms.
- Undertake land tenure reform: resolve leases, digitise titles, reduce corruption.
- Ensure **farmer representation** on national boards.



 Establish an Agricultural Data Bureau for output, pricing, land, and labour data.

# IMMEDIATE POLICY ACTIONS (FIRST 24 MONTHS)

- Conduct a National Agricultural Census
- Launch the People's Agricultural
   Transformation Programme (PATP)
- Provide 20,000 low-interest agri-loans for youth and women
- Develop 10 Climate-Resilient Model
   Farms
- Adopt the CARICOM Agri-Food Strategy as national policy
- Rehabilitate 5 key drainage and irrigation schemes
